Dear Speaker Ryan and Democratic Leader Pelosi,

AASA, The School Superintendents Association, representing more than 13,000 school system leaders across the country, supports passage of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). We commend Congress for its collaborative work on this bipartisan, bicameral piece of legislation which reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).

The federal government has a critical role to play in federal education policy, and that is to support and strengthen—not dictate and prescribe to—our nation’s public schools. ESSA is a strong representation of this policy, preserving very important federal policy cornerstones such as equity, accountability, standards and assessments, but doing so in a way that empowers state and local education leaders to more effectively operate the systems for which they are responsible.

Congress has a long list of items to address this year. We commend both the House and the Senate for maintaining steady momentum for ESEA over this summer and fall. We applaud Representatives John Kline and Bobby Scott and Senators Lamar Alexander and Patty Murray for their leadership throughout this process. ESEA is the primary K-12 education bill shaping our nation’s K-12 educational environment and experience and the Every Student Succeeds Act represents a marked improvement over current law. ESSA provides our nation’s schools and the students they serve with a modernized, flexible approach to federal education policy. We strongly support ESSA and urge swift passage in both the House and Senate.
